DRUG-FREE DUBBO



Drug and alcohol testing can happen at any Speedway Australia race meeting, and last weekend we utilised the services of national provider TDDA to conduct a number of tests at Dubbo Speedway. We're pleased to be able to report that all of the randomly selected competitors recorded negative results.

The process we utilise is to conduct an oral screening test, which takes around 10 minutes before the competitor is back on their way. In the event of a non-negative reading a further urine test is conducted, as this process is a more accurate method of determining if a substance is

present. If this test is also non-negative, then the result is deemed to be in breach of Speedway Australia's rules. The competitor is issued an infringement notice, removed from the pit are and their samples are sent away for laboratory testing,
