The new portal has three key benefits for venue operators throughout the nation.

- No more prepayments
- No more paper forms
- No more messy cancellations or credits

To quickly get all venue operators up to speed, we've put together an educational video and webpage explaining exactly how the system works. This system marks the first major change in streamlining and modernizing the permit process and will continue to be developed over time.

The portal is available to be used for all permit applications from 31st October 2021 through to 31st August 2022. It's important to remember your permit applications will not be processed until you have returned your commitment form and deposit premium to Gallagher.
