A NOTE ABOUT CORONAVIRUS



There are no new revelations here, other than to say we are clearly in uncharted waters as far as how this ongoing battle with a bug will negatively impact on speedway in the immediate future.

Please take advice from experts when making decisions about your involvement with upcoming race meetings, either as a venue operator, divisional body or participant. If state or federal government announcements impact on the operation of the sport, then we must follow any requirements or decisions that they make. We're all in this together, so making informed decisions is the best way to pull through for both speedway and the wider community.

LICENCE UPGRADES

With thousands of competitors around the country at any one time, there are always a portion who are in the process from moving from one division to another while others race multiple classes either on a regular or casual basis.

The key message here is that competitors must have a licence that reflects the divisions they are racing, at all times. It is a requirement under Speedway Australia rules, and is also a requirement of insurers.

A licence upgrade to add more divisions that requires the payment of an additional fee can be processed via the Speedway Australia app (at the bottom of the licence card screen, under "view digital card"). Adding a division when a fee isn't payable can be requested by emailing <u>admin@speedwayaustralia.net.au</u>.

We hope to have complete functionality for both options on the App soon, but in the meantime, this is the best way to tick off the necessary paperwork.
