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FIELD SIZES CLARIFIED

We're quite often asked what the maximum field sizes are of various tracks around the country, so at our board meeting earlier this week a simplified policy was signed off which we can publish.

Open Wheel and modified maximum field sizes are now 30 cars unless a venue has specific approval. These venues are listed on the website. If you are unsure if your venue is approved, please contact the relevant authority. A written approval stating the details may still be required to ensure you are complying with the rules effectively.

Sedan maximum field sizes are 20 cars unless a venue has specific approval. A written approval stating the details may still be required to ensure you are complying with the rules effectively.

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WE ARE AUSTRALIAN SPEEDWAY

Applications are now open for the 2019/20 Speedway Australia Rising Star Officials Program. The Official Rising Star Program will take place in conjunction with the highest-pressure road race in Australia - Speedway - World Series Sprintcars Speedweek!

Starting in Murray Bridge on Boxing Night, four selected Rising Stars will be involved in a variety of experiences and learning situations. During the week each individual will buddy up with an experienced administrator and mentor, including the Chief Steward, WSS Race Director and Assistant Race Director, WSS Race Secretary, Adelaide and Warrambool, and accommodation from Dec 26 to January 2, with all expenses covered - even their airfare.

We want to hear from Speedway Australia officials who are willing to come on the road during Speedweek and meet the following criteria:

- A Speedway Australia licensed official as of 31 August 2019
- Under the age of 40 in keeping with the Rising Star philosophy of developing young talent
- Have a direction and desire to advance within the sport
- Show a history of involvement with tracks or division
- Be able to endure the physical and mental strain of Speedway, with long days and constant travel
- Have a driver's licence (to share the rental car driving duties)

We will be reaching out to all licensed officials under the age of 40 in the coming weeks, with an invitation to apply for the Rising Star Program. If you know of someone who meets the above criteria, but isn't currently a Speedway Australia Licensed Official, we may encourage them to become an official now for the chance to be involved in the exciting experience of a lifetime!

Applications can be made online, using the form via the link below. In addition to the personal details, applicants are also required to submit a brief presentation outlining their suitability.

PREPARING FOR ELECTRONIC LICENCING

We've talked about this for 18 months, but change is finally in the air with regard to the replacement of licence cards in favour of an electronic system. We are at the final testing stage, which is bringing a light number of tweaks and the final stages of processes that need to be rectified before we can make the move.

The major change from an administration perspective is the pre-approval of licences by clubs before Speedway Australia issue the licence. To make this a smooth process for licence holders we've talked with divisional bodies and have introduced the following changes:

- Speedway Sectors Australian Licences will be checked to the nominated affiliated club for approval, rather than being posted to SSA state branches. This is a national reallocation of the system currently operating in Western Australia.
- Formula 500 Licences will all be characterised to the relevant 500 state body for approval, rather than being posted to SSA state branches. This is a national reallocation of the system currently operating in Western Australia.
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More information will follow as we get closer to the big day, but we are committed to ensuring the printing of licence cards is a smooth process with electronic cards. We will continue until we are 100% confident that the sport can handle the new arrangements.

SUCCESSFUL NATIONAL FORUM WEEKEND

Every National Division along with a total of 26 tracks were represented at last weekend's National Forum of the Adelaide Convention Centre.

Building on the success of the previous two National Forum weekends, the event allowed Speedway Australia's stakeholder groups to come together for open discussion around leadership, networking, along with product and industry services knowledge. It also gave Tracks and Divisions an opportunity to view featured the growth in participation of our sport's wheelchair - coupled with the record low entry data for the last 12 months.

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TRACK GRANT SCHEME

\$50,000 FOR IMMEDIATE SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS AT RATED TRACKS
APPLICATIONS NOW CLOSED

Speedway Australia's successful Safety Grant Program has been extended to increase the total amount to \$50,000. The program is designed to support tracks in making safety improvements to their facilities, ensuring the safety of all participants.

The grant is available for tracks that have been rated as 'at risk' or 'poor' in their most recent safety audit. The grant can be used for a wide range of safety improvements, including the installation of safety barriers, the replacement of damaged safety equipment, and the implementation of safety protocols.

Tracks that have been successful in applying for the grant will receive the grant funds within a few weeks of the completion of their safety audit. We are committed to supporting the safety of all participants in the sport.

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SEASONAL COMPETITORS

The addition of international competitors is usually a guaranteed cross-pollinator for tracks around the country, and for a long time Speedway Australia has offered them a complimentary licence for up to five nights of racing.

We want to further encourage the addition of international competitors into the racing mix, so have established a second category of licence that allows professional racers to compete for up to a month on a complimentary licence.

Category One - All Overseas Competitors

Are eligible for a complimentary licence for up to five non-nominate days of racing, without the need for a medical certificate. Valid for all Speedway Australia tracks, including youth clubs.

Category Two - Overseas Speedway Professionals

Active speedway professionals who are citizens of an overseas country and predominantly race overseas are eligible to obtain a complimentary Speedway Australia licence valid for up to a month on a complimentary licence. 2010 VERSUS 2020

With an ever-improving availability of information and analysis, Speedway Australia is able to make better-informed decisions about the implementation of its plans and strategies. Much of this did not exist 10 years ago, but one key marker that we have been able to track over time is the growth of the sport on a state-by-state basis.

Between 2010 and 2020 Speedway Australia's licence base grew by 37%, with some spectacular increases in a number of states: -

Tasmania	96%	SA	2%
NSW/ACT	86%	NT	-2%
QLD	56%	Overall	37%

It should be noted that NT's figures are expected to bounce back with the reopening of Tennant Creek and Alice Springs after construction works. We also hope to be able to extract information on a divisional basis, as time allows (this involves rebuilding the database from 2010).

Out of interest, speedway appears to be one of the few sports recording consistent growth over time. A 2017 Roy Morgan survey showed only 1 in 5 organised sports are growing faster than the rate of population increase, with sports such as Rugby, Tennis and Golf all shrinking by between 25 and 60%.

HEALTHY SPORTING CLUB PROGRAM



Applications have opened today for the McGowan Government's Healthy Sporting Club Program with \$300,000 up for grabs to help sporting clubs across Western Australia provide healthier food and drinks.

The Healthy Sporting Club Program consists of a winter and summer funding round, which provides up to \$4,000 to local clubs. The funds can be used to purchase canteen equipment and train canteen managers on how to provide healthier food and drink options.

Applications for the 2020 Winter Healthy Sporting Club program are now open and close at 12 noon, Friday March 13.
