COVID RELIEF AVAILABLE FOR VICTORIAN WORKERS



Paid track operators and workers, together with those employed within the Speedway industry may benefit from the Federal Governments new, temporary COVID Disaster payment which will provide financial support for areas defined as COVID-19 national hotspots and are undergoing lockdown for more than seven days.

Under certain criteria, people who are unable to work due to lockdown restrictions and who had worked more than 20 hours in a week will be paid

\$500 and people who worked less than 20 hours a week will received \$325.

Some of the key criteria to qualify for the temporary COVID-19 disaster payment include being an Australian citizen, or resident based in an area that defined as a Commonwealth determined hotspot. You must also be engaged in paid employment and unable to attend work and therefore incapable to earn an income as a result of state health restrictions, be at least 17 years old, and have liquid assets of less than \$10,000.
