RACE MEETINGS AND PRACTICES DURING COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS



All states and territories have now firmed up their restrictions and most have provided guidance for venue operators undertaking outdoor events for less than 500 people. Every track scheduled to run this weekend has now cancelled, apart from Carnarvon in WA.

If you are still planning on running either race meetings or practices (and there are a handful of tracks in this position), we will be in touch pre-event to assist with regulatory compliance and risk

mitigation. There are some small additional requirements in terms of signage and armbands that we are recommending, but these seem to be changing on a hour-by-hour basis so there is little point is distributing to everyone now.
