A QUICK OVERVIEW: STAR RATINGS

During our recent track inspections tours, several venues have queried how the Speedway Australia Star Rating system works. The below information can be found on page 10 of the Track Operators Manual, with page 11 covering the actual measurements required for each level.

The variables taken into consideration when determining a track rating are the track safety fence, construction material, catch fence (posts and cables) dimensions and crowd control fence. There is also a list of permitted classes and event types that can be run on tracks rated from 1 Star through to 5 Star.

A description of a track safety fence, guide to new fence construction, and correct procedures for the fitting of wire rope grips is also provided.

OVERVIEW OF THE STAR RATINGS

- **5 Star Rating** A world leader in speedway venues, meeting the highest standards
- **4 Star Rating** Venue exceeds many of the minimum standards for all forms of speedway vehicles
- 3 Star Rating Track meets the minimum standards to run all forms of speedway vehicles
- 2 Star Rating Track meets the minimum standards for all classes excluding Sprintcars
- **1 Star Rating** Track meets the minimum standards for Sedan racing, Karting, Vintage demonstrations & Junior Quarter Midgets

THE DIFFERNCE: SPEEDWAY SEDANS AUSTRALIA VS. SPEEDWAY AUSTRALIA STEWARD / SCRUTINEER CARDS

A quick reminder that Speedway Sedans Australia Steward and Scrutineer Cards are not the same as Speedway Australia Steward and Scrutineer Cards. The cards that Speedway Sedans Australia issue (green and yellow) are only for their divisions being:

SSA Super Sedans SSA Modified Sedans SSA National 4's SSA Production Sedans SSA Street Stocks SSA Junior Sedans

If a person only Stewards or Scrutineers the above six divisions they only need to hold a Speedway Sedans Australia Card. If a person Stewards or Scrutineers any other division recognised by Speedway

Australia they need hold a Speedway Australia Steward or Scrutineer Card as per the Racing Rules and Regulations. You may also notice that Speedway Sedans Australia Steward and Scrutineer Card expire in the year 2020. This does not mean a person does not have to renew their Speedway Australia Licence annually.
