RECORD TURNOUT FOR AWARDS AND FORUM

It's just over two weeks until the Australian speedway community comes together in Brisbane for a number of spectacular Speedway Australia hosted events. The venue for all of the festivities on Saturday 23 June is Rydges Southbank in Brisbane, and anticipated attendances are well up on previous years.

The Australian Speedway Awards will see 12 high achievers from the 2017/18 season recognised for their efforts, while another five legends will be inducted into the Australian Speedway Hall of Fame. Tickets for the gala dinner are still available via this link.

Doors open to the 12th floor function room at 6:30pm, with proceedings kicking off at 7pm sharp. Dress code is cocktail for Ladies and shirt & tie for gents, with complimentary beverages until 10:30pm. We've already blitzed the turnout from the two previous events, so look forward to welcoming as many people as possible.

REMINDER: STATE BRANCHES TO CLOSE

Just a reminder that Speedway Australia's state branches will permanently close on July 1. In most cases the functions that these organisations currently undertake will be picked up by the Speedway Australia office.

This will enable Speedway Australia to offer the same services on a consistent basis nationwide, with exciting initiatives in the aspects of Junior, Safety and Officials training to be announced in the coming months. There are no plans to increase fees to cover the additional workload, so tracks and divisions who were currently paying an affiliation fee to a state branch will notice a saving moving forward.

In South Australia, the state branch personnel will continue to undertake the state-level tasks of Speedway Sedans Australia and Formula 500's Australia, as they do already. However, a new organisation will be required to continue to operate. In New South Wales, liaison with the Department of Sport and Recreation will now generally be undertaken by the Office via Liz (Track and Safety Development) and Tim (General Manager). We already enjoy a good working relationship with Kevin Frew and the team at the Department and will be happy to assist as necessary with venue obligations in that regard.

Obviously with the winding down of the respective committee's several people will be relinquished from their obligations, some of whom have been involved for a number of years. We thank them for their services to the sport and expect that many will pick up other roles that utilise their considerable talents.



NEW RULES ENFORCED JULY 1ST

A quick reminder to everyone that rule changes in regard to Horse Collars, Socks & Arm Restraints come into effect as of July 1st 2018, as advised in the Speedway Australia Racing Rules & Regulations. Please ensure Scrutineers are checking all items of safety gear and that competitors are educated to ensure compliance with these rules. Note: All foam Horse Collars must be SFI 3.3 Spec.
