




Welcome to the 120th edition of Speedway Australia's Speed eNews.

OFFICIALS TRAINING PLATFORM – ONLINE HELP AVAILABLE



Over 200 Stewards and Scrutineers have now completed the Speedway Australia officials training course, which is a self-paced online program that has a mix of speedway-related training and government-approved general sporting modules.

As we continue to refine the system, we've developed a larger knowledge bank of information to assist officials with getting started on the online platform, and if they need help along the way, It can be accessed here:-

Some aspects of the training (particularly the Australian Institute of Sport modules) are proving a little challenging to navigate around for some people, hence the need for more guidance. We mentioned a few weeks ago that Ross Kirby is available to assist with enquiries during WA business hours, and that offer still stands.

We currently have three streams of learning (for people who are Stewards, Scrutineers or both), but are contemplating merging these

into one overall platform so that all officials have a basic understanding of both roles. We are happy to take feedback from divisional groups on this, before we make a decision.

A reminder too that this is the only training course approved for Speedway Australia officials, and it has been endorsed by all national speedway bodies such as Speedway Sedans Australia, the SCCA and SKAA Karts.

Programs run by other groups are not recognised by us or our divisional body partners, so no matter what they may tell you there is no requirement to obtain other qualifications to gain or keep your accreditation.






COVID-19 RESOURCE CENTRE NOW ONLINE



STAKEHOLDER SURVEY – HOURS PER WEEK ON SPEEDWAY ACTIVITIES

One of the questions we asked in our recent survey attempted to ascertain how many hours per week respondents spend on speedway activities.

This is a question that seeks to determine the level of engagement in the sport by its stakeholders. And while at first glance the wagon wheel is fairly evenly spread, when collated, the information shows that over 60% of respondents spend more than two hours a day on speedway, and 40% spend three hours or more. Over a quarter spend 4-5 hours per day on the sport during the season.

That makes speedway an all-consuming passion for a huge portion of our stakeholders!
